
Johnny Carrabba III, a native of the historic East End Houston, was raised in his parent's family-owned business, Carrabba's Friendly Grocery. In 1986, Johnny opened the original Carrabba's on

Kirby, and a second location on South Voss Road opened its doors in 1988. The Carrabba family created a joint venture partnership with Outback Steakhouse and opened 230 restaurants nationwide, including ten in Brazil, and future locations in Mexico. Johnny and his family continue to own and operate the two original Carrabba's locations. In 2012, the family's new fast-casual concept, Mia's Table, opened one block behind the Original Carrabba's on Kirby. In 2014, Grace's, affectionately named after Johnny's grandmother, Grace Mandola, opened its doors, forging the fourth family -owned and operated restaurant. Mia's Table has five locations and continues to grow. Johnny is a philanthropist at heart and gives back to the community through many venues and charities, especially those benefiting children. He has two beloved children, Johnny IV and Mia.

The three Charity selections are described below in alphabetical order:







Bridging for Tomorrow assists families, single mothers, and children in the Klein and Aldine surrounding areas. They work closely with over 100 single mothers and families to help provide a food bank, counseling, mentoring, referral services, clothing, and housing to assist them in getting back on their feet. They partner with 13 local schools and receive support from local churches working together for the community. Additional programs they offer for adults are counseling, finance classes, reading, ESL classes, and government application assistance for benefits.

Inspiration Ranch works with children, youth, and adults with physical, emotional, and social disabilities of approximately 100 individuals. They believe riding, equine therapy and various related activities help strengthen their core muscles, improve their walking, and improve their ability to communicate. They also have a mental health program that reaches out to those with severe emotional trauma by teaching new boundaries, skills, and how to overcome obstacles.


Are you ready for some Houston history? Then this is the tour for you.

We are scheduled for a 10:00 - 11:30 a.m. Glenwood Cemetery Art & Architecture walking tour. Glenwood is the resting place of some of Houston's most notable residents. It's also a sculpture garden filled with examples of outstanding funeral art from the past century and a half, outstanding monuments, the symbolism and stories behind the monuments, and the lives of Houstonians, both famous and forgotten, who commissioned them.

We will have lunch at Treebeards The Cloister, which is located at Christ Church Cathedral. Christ Church was established in 1839 when Texas was still an independent republic. Many of Houston's notable were also parishioners at Christ Church. We are scheduled for a 1:00 p.m. tour of the cathedral.

The Precinct 3 bus will depart from the George H. W. Bush Community Center located at 6827 Cypresswood Drive in Spring. The bus will be available for boarding at 8:30 a.m. and will depart at 9:00 a.m. We should return around 4:00 p.m.
