


Guest Speaker Jim Parsons with Preservation Houston

Jim Parsons, a native of Baytown, brings his lifelong passion for history and architecture to his role as Programs Director for Preservation Houston. He leads the organization's




educational outreach and public programs, which include neighborhood walking tours, video



We wish to extend a warm welcome to our newest members who have joined since the March newsletter:



BOYS AND GIRLS COUNTRY: www.boysandgirlscountry.org

Mission: Our mission is to change the lives of children from families in crisis by loving and nurturing them in a Christian home environment, and raising them to become self-sustaining and contributing adults.

Vision: That every child has a place to grow up and a sense of being home.

Boys And Girls Country is a licensed residential home that serves children ages 5-18 and young adults 18 and up. They use a trauma-informed care model to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of each child with an emphasis on providing a stable, Christian home environment.



CAMP SHIELD: www.campshield.org

Mission: Camp Shield's mission is collaborating to empower women veterans – emotionally, socially and physically – to ensure she thrives after military service.

Camp Shield offers retreats, workshops, peer support and social activities. They strive to support the personal and professional success of veterans and their families by increasing resiliency, life satisfaction and empowerment. Camp Shield is filling the gap for the underrepresented women veteran population.



MOVING WATERS: www.movingwaters-houston.org

Mission: To improve the quality of life for the unhoused men and women in Galveston-Houston.

Moving Waters currently provides 600 showers a month at four weekly partner locations. They distribute hygiene supplies, clean underwear and socks to extend the dignity of those that they serve. Guests are provided with a 20-minute hot shower, and are able to complete all necessary self-care tasks on-site.

Moving Waters opened in 2021 and have provided over 20,000 showers to 3,400 individuals. They also work with The University of Houston's College of Pharmacy to collect data to determine mental health diagnoses and substance use that exists amongst the unhoused. This data is used to implement a program and reduce risk of overdose among these guests.




