The following is proposed changes submitted by the By-laws Committee consisting of Sherry Dunn, Markett Harkinson, Carol Huddleston, Idalia Skates, and Trish Torgersen.

ARTICLE 4 - MEETINGS

Section 3. The last meeting of the Club year is to be referred to as the Annual Installation Luncheon Meeting and will be held in May.

ARTICLE 6- EXECUTIVE AND EXTENDED BOARD

Section 6. Each Officer and Chairperson shall keep a notebook of activities and procedures to facilitate the change of office. Procedure notebooks shall be given to each newly elected Officer at the New Board/Old Board Luncheon, business meeting immediately following the Installation Luncheon. If not attending the New Board/Old Board Luncheon, each Officer is responsible for passing the notebook to the newly elected Officer before Installation-June 1st. Installation of Executive Officers shall take place at the Annual Installation Luncheon. Newly elected Officers assume their duties IMMEDIATELY June 1st with the exception of the Treasurer who will serve until books are completed and closed, as directed in Article 8, Section 5. In addition, a final year-end report must be provided to the President by each outgoing Executive Officer at or before the Installation Luncheon. The Executive Officers and the Extended Board year-end reports must be provided to the President before the New Board/Old Board Luncheon. The New Board/Old Board Luncheon meeting will be held before the end of May. Installation of Officers is optional at April or May meeting.

Section 8. "FAN duties of Executive Board and Extended Board," which is printed on the FAN Website, is to be updated as By-laws are revised.

ARTICLE 8- DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 8. The Historian shall keep a memory book of all important Club activities and events of the year. The memory book shall be presented to the retiring President at the New Board/Old Board Installation-Luncheon, and then displayed at the General Meetings the following year.

Programs for developmentally challenged to benefit from FAN's 2015 charity

"Ladies, how many of you like children?" was the question **Margie Rogers** asked of FAN members at the October General Meeting. A sea of hands shot into the air, and Margie began to describe her personal experience as a pediatric nurse caring for developmentally challenged children and their families.

That's how she introduced a profile of Reach Unlimited, one of three distinctive types of charities the Board this year selected for members to consider to receive the proceeds from the Christmas Luncheon on December 2. When the votes were counted, Reach Unlimited and its clients became this year's FAN charity.

Reach Unlimited provides 24/7 care in group homes to more than 100 clients, and daytime services to another 325. Reach Unlimited offers a sustainable, secure environment so that these individuals may reach their full potential.

Through vocational skill training, supported employment, personal development and recreation activities, Reach Unlimited encourages clients to benefit from continuous learning. Clients range from 12 to 74 years. There's even a Special Olympics softball team, the "Reach Rockets."

The Learning Activity Center teaches life skills, functional academics, art, music and fitness, as well as prevocational and vocational training. Clients earn a paycheck in the enterprise program, perhaps making sparkling fused-glass art pieces, or embossing napkins for customers' parties and special events.

Area companies also contract with Reach and its client workforce for jobs such as preparing mailings or assembling information packets. Their pride in receiving a paycheck matches their satisfaction in doing worthwhile work.

Caring for and teaching these neighbors is expensive and very poorly supported by public funds. That's why Reach Unlimited staff and volunteers must raise \$1,000,000 every year to underwrite client services. It's clear, however, that theirs is a labor of love. Enthusiastically describing Reach Unlimited clients and their activities, one executive said, "We love them dearly."
