

FAN Day Trip: 'Houston's Past and Most Notable Residents' on Friday, November 10th

Are you ready for some Houston history? Then this is the tour for you.

We are scheduled for a 10–11:30 a.m. Glenwood Cemetery Art & Architecture walking tour. Glenwood is the resting place of some of Houston's most notable residents. It's also a sculpture garden filled with examples of outstanding funeral art from the past century and a half, outstanding monuments, the symbolism and stories behind the monuments, and the lives of Houstonians, both famous and forgotten, who commissioned them.

We will have lunch at Treebeards The Cloister, which is located at Christ Church Cathedral. Christ Church was established in 1839 when Texas was still an independent republic. Many of Houston's notable were also parishioners at Christ Church. We are scheduled for a 1 p.m. tour of the cathedral.

The Precinct 3 bus will depart from the George H. W. Bush Community Center at 6827 Cypresswood Drive, Spring. The bus will be available for boarding at 8:30 a.m. and will depart at 9 a.m. We should return around 4 p.m.




