Celebrating 45 Years of FAN-TABULOUS Ladies:

The History of Friends And Neighbors Women's Club (FAN)

As we celebrate FAN's 45th Anniversary, it's a great time to honor the club's history and our founder, who started the club we all continue to enjoy 45 years later.

FAN began as a Welcome Wagon Club in 1979 when founder Joanne Thomas moved to Houston from Massachusetts where she was involved in a Welcome Wagon Club. When learning that no Welcome Wagon Club existed in this area, she began talking to her neighbors in Lakewood Forest about her project to start a Welcome Wagon Club. In February of 1979, a meeting was held at Cypress Creek Christian Community Center, and thus, Welcome Wagon was "born." By 1986, membership had grown to 171. Welcome Wagon met



continually at Cypress Creek Christian Community Center, except for the years 1981 and 1982 when they met at Northwoods Presbyterian Church. Eleanor Knerr, the Historian, recorded this information on April 1, 1986.

In 1994, Welcome Wagon headquarters informed all clubs to drop members who had been in Welcome Wagon for more than three years because it was only for "newcomers" to the area. They also suggested that non-newcomers start an "alumni" club of sorts. However, so many friendships had been created, and members appreciated the opportunity to meet other newcomers that this proposal did not appeal to our club. In addition, meeting programs were limited to Welcome Wagon sponsors and community groups only, and membership was restricted only to ladies who had "moved" into the community.

At the September 1994 General Meeting, Selina Patterson, President, with the approval of the FAN Board, offered a proposal to the general membership to organize our group under a new name, "Friends And Neighbors of FM 1960 Women's Club." With the new name came a new purpose, which was to include all ladies who were indeed "newcomers," and also to include other friends and neighbors who resided in the Northwest area and surrounding communities who were interested in our club and its activities. A further benefit of this organization is that we could now provide programs for the General Meeting of a greater variety and interest to our members.

In March of 2020 our Bylaws were revised to include a reflection on the growth of Northwest Houston whereas we changed the group name from "Friends And Neighbors of FM 1960" to the current "Friends And Neighbors Women's Club (FAN)."

FAN Day Trip: 'Fallen Warriors and the National Museum of Funeral History'

We are scheduled for a 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. tour of the Fallen Warriors Gallery, followed by a tour of the Memorial. Ken Pridgeon, Sr. is the artist who paints portraits of those who paid the ultimate price for the rest of us who live in freedom. He works things into the foreground of the paintings that had meaning to these fallen heroes. We see them as individuals who played the guitar or football, as an example. Ken Pridgeon knows each fallen warrior as if they were his sons or daughters, and consequently, each of his paintings tells a story. Mr. Pridgeon will personally do the tour.

We will have lunch at a restaurant to be determined.

After lunch, we are scheduled for a docent-led tour at the National Museum of Funeral History, including the much anticipated new permanent exhibit 'The Most Famous Burial of All Time: The Shroud of Turin,' which opened in April 2023.





FAN Day Trip: 'Weird & Wacky Iconic Houston' on Friday, March 15th

Are you ready to tour some of Houston's iconic landmarks? Then this is the tour for you.

We are scheduled for a 10:00 a.m. tour of the Beer Can House. It is a folk art house covered with beer cans, bottles, and other beer paraphernalia. Beginning in 1968 and continuing for 18 years, John Milkovich began altering his home and garden in Houston's Rice Military neighborhood, one beer can at a time, into an elegant and original showplace.

We are scheduled for a tour of the iconic Orange Show. Starting in 1956, Jeff McKissack, a mail carrier in Houston, personally transformed a small suburban lot in honor of his favorite fruit. He used bits of junk and material salvaged along his mail route, and it opened to the public in 1979. It's 3,000 square feet filled with a multi-decked building and series of rooms, a wishing well, an amphitheater with an array of old tractor seats, a pond, and an oasis.

We will visit mosaic-covered Smither Park, an urban space developed over time with help from artists and friends of the park. Visionary artist and builder Dan Phillips worked with Stephanie Smither to form the park in memory of her late husband, John H. Smither.


